- 1. Find the derivative and the second derivative of the following functions.
- a. $f(x) = 10x^4 32x + e^2$ $f'(x) = 40x^3 - 32$ $f''(x) = 120x^2$ b. $g(w) = \frac{w^3 - w}{w} = -1$ g'(w) = 2wg''(w) = 2

2. Find the equation of the tangent line at $y = \frac{e^x}{4} - x$, when x = 0.

 $Y' = \frac{1}{4}e^{x} - 1 \qquad Y'(0) = \frac{1}{4}e^{0} - 1 = \frac{1}{4}(1) - 1 = -\frac{3}{4} \quad \text{slope}$ $Y(0) = \frac{e^{0}}{4} - 0 = \frac{1}{4} \qquad \text{point on graph } (0, \frac{1}{4})$ $Y - Y_{1} = in(x - x_{1}) \Rightarrow Y - \frac{1}{4} = -\frac{3}{4}(x - 0) \Rightarrow Y = -\frac{3}{4}x + \frac{1}{4}$

3. Use the product rule and the quotient rule as appropriate to find the derivative of the functions. a. $h(x) = \frac{e^x}{e^{x+1}}$ $f = e^x$ $g = e^{x+1}$ $h'(x) = \frac{e^x(e^x + 1) - e^x \cdot e^x}{(e^x + 1)^2} = \frac{e^x}{(e^x + 1)^2}$

b.
$$m(x) = (x^2 - 1)e^{-x}$$

 $f = \chi^2 - 1$ $g = e^{-\chi}$
 $g' = 2\chi$ $g' = -e^{-\chi}$ or $[2\chi e^{-\chi} - (\chi^2 - 1)e^{-\chi}]$
