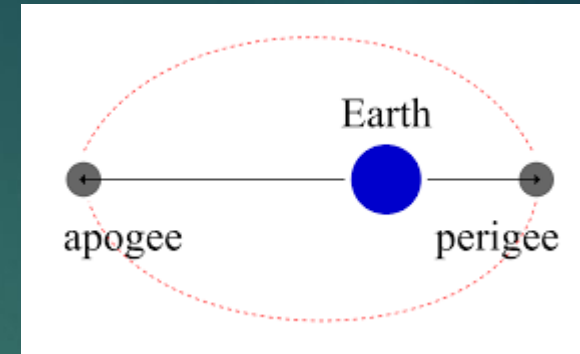
Overview

Review for Unit 10 Exam

The story of “apogee”



APOGEE WAS ORIGINALLY A TERM COMING FROM ASTRONOMY. PERIGEE IS THE CLOSEST POINT A SATELLITE MAKES TO THE EARTH ON ITS ORBIT (LOWEST ALTITUDE), AND APOGEE IS THE FURTHEST POINT (THE HIGHEST ALTITUDE).



OTHER ASTRONOMICAL BODIES HAVE SIMILAR TERMS, FOR EXAMPLE FOR THE SUN WE USE PERIHELION AND APHELION (THE CLOSEST AND FURTHER POINTS TO THE SUN, RESPECTIVELY).



FOR SOME TERMS, THEY BECOME SO FREQUENTLY USED IN THEIR METAPHORICAL SENSE THAT THAT BECOMES TO DOMINANT MEANING AND THE CONNECTION TO ITS ORIGINAL MEANING MAY BE EVEN BE LOST.
